


Fun Facts



- Rotuma is a volcanic island around 465km north of Fiji
- Rotuma is approximately half the size of Waiheke Island
- The Rotuman culture is closely linked to the Polynesian islands like Tonga, Samoa
- Although Rotumans have their own distinct culture & language, they are governed by Fiji
- According to the last census conducted in 2017, there are 1,594 people living on the island.
- During the 2018 census, 981 New Zealanders identified as being Rotuman
- There are 7 Districts in Rotuma

Tefui

A Tefui is a beautifully scented garland that is unique to the people of Rotuma. Used as an acknowledgement of respect and gratitude or as an adornment for performers of the traditional Rotuman dance, the Tautoga, the Tefui is a treasured gift in any Rotuman family.

The pieces of a Tefui include small stars with a red diamond centerpiece (Fui).



When used in a Tautoga, the males will have seven 'Fui' within their garland and females have the one Fui. In NZ, tefui is made using ribbon, wool and artificial flowers.

However, in Rotuma, coconut tree shoot, scented flowers and natural resources are used.

The Rotuman Alphabet has the 5 standard vowels



There are slightly different ways of pronouncing the vowels below
