Reading and speaking Fäeag Rotuam

Fäeag Rotuam ta (The Rotuman Language) has five basic vowels:

AEIOU.

These basic vowels have similar pronunciation to other Pacific Languages including Te Reo Māori.

There are also five variations to these vowels: Ä Å Å Ö Ü. There are slightly different ways of pronouncing the vowels A, O and U.

The basic vowels can be short or long with the long vowel sound indicated by a macron above the vowel. Long vowel sounds are slightly dragged out.

A, E, I, O, U Ā, Ē, Ī, Ō, Ū,

It is important to show this distinction as it affects the meaning of words. For example:

Koko mischievous / bad **Kōkō** thorny / prickly

Toto blood

Tōtō to speak / utter

These are pronounced as in English with a few differences:

The **G** is pronounced as the **NG** sound in **SING**.

The **R** is slightly **rolled**.

The **J** is pronounced like **CH** in CHURCH and never as J in JUDGE or JUG.

The **[1] glottal stop** is the sound made in the middle of the phrase Oh-oh or Uh-oh.
