Samoan Language

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The core Samoan alphabet is comprised of 14 letters:

The consonants (konesane): **F, G, L, M, N, P, S, T** and **V**

The vowels (vaueli): **A, E, I, O** and **U** (as in the English: **are, there, three, or, too**).

These vowels have the same pronunciation as other Pacific languages, including te reo Māori (Māori language).

The letters **K, H** and **R** are also used, but usually for foreign loanwords and/or for colloquial language. Vowels can be long or short. Long vowels are marked with a macron (e.g. ā).

ā, ē, ī, ō, ū

(as in the English: **father, egg, feet, thought, loot**)

It is important that the short and long vowel sounds are used, as they distinguish between different words e.g. **ava** (respect) versus **āvā** (wife).
