### Thriving Pacific Languages, Cultures & Identities

### Language and culture are a source of strength

Our languages and cultures are vital to our identity, grounding us and giving us confidence.

It is important we ensure their sustainability going forward and to recognise the significant part that Pacific communities play in supporting New Zealand's overall contribution in Pacific festivals, arts, culture and heritage sector.

Budget 2020 allocates \$1.7m for the Pacific Content initiative which will support an all of government approach to the development of content about the government's response to COVID-19, targeting Pacific families and community groups across Aotearoa in their languages and in culturally appropriate ways.

Additionally, funding has been approved for Pacific festivals and the establishment of a New Zealand Fale Malae, ensuring the continued growth of Pacific culture and languages.

## Prosperous Pacific Communities

Creating opportunity for employment and business development will be key to our recovery from the effects of COVID-19. Our budget focuses on providing Pacific communities with the opportunities they need and deserve.

Budget 2020 provides funding for programmes and initiatives, including Tupu Aotearoa, The MBIE Auckland Pacific Skills Shift, The Pacific Aotearoa Community COVID-19 Recovery Fund and the Pacific Procurement Support Service, which will support the needs of our Pacific communities in employment, redeployment, training and business sustainability and development.
